STUDY ABROAD

Eligibility requirements include:

- Acceptance into a Muma College of Business Living Learning Community
- Completed application form
- High School GPA of at least 3.50 (weighted)
- SAT score of at least 1210 (minimum 570 math) OR ACT score of at least 25 (minimum 25 math)

While the above are the minimum eligibility criteria, this is a highlycompetitive program, and last year the average scores for students selected for the Muma Business Honors Program obtained an SAT score of 1270 or an ACT score of 29, and the average weighted GPA was 4.15.

1. **Two letters of recommendation** from any current or former teacher or faculty member. Please have the person writing the letter either email the letter to us directly or place the document in an envelope and sign their name across the back flap of the envelope. Include both letters with the other materials submitted.

2. An academic/professional résumé. Remember to include academic awards and honors, positions of leadership, memberships in clubs and organizations, extracurricular activities, and employment. Please provide an estimate of how much time is devoted per week for each item.

3. A **photograph** to allow faculty to recognize and identify you for the interview appointment.

Florence, Italy

The Business Honors Program is one of the most prestigious programs at the University of South Florida's Muma College of Business. The program was established to inspire passion and nurture exemplary potential in students. - Attend one semester of speaker series lectures
- Regularly attend and participate in Business Honors Program and Living-Learning Community activities
- Complete and present a thesis

INTERNSHIPS
