The program partners international and domestic students to increase cultural awareness and build lasting friendships through a series of campus events and social programs. The iBuddy program enhances and encourages out of classroom student engagement that assists participants in becoming global citizens.

INTERCULTURAL STUDENT LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE (ISLC): is designed to strengthen the engagement and retention of underrepresented students at the University of South Florida by providing inspiration, co-curricular connections, and campus resources to support their path to success



ARTS AND SCIENCES

THE DEAN'S STUDENT LEADERSHIP SOCIETY: represents the College of Arts and Sciences at a variety of events, including scholarship banquets, alumni reunions, USF Family Weekend, Freshman Orientation, public lectures and Homecoming.

BEHAVIORAL AND COMMUNITY SCIENCES

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH STUDENT ORGANIZATION: serves as a forum for those with an interest in Behavioral Health. Their mission is to educate and increase awareness of Behavioral Health issues and projects within the United States and abroad. They provide ample service and learning opportunities to network with students, faculty and the greater Behavioral Health community.

CRIMINOLOGY GRADUATE STUDENT ORGANIZATION: The purpose of the CGSO is to serve and advocate for graduate students within the department of Criminology both at the departmental and university levels. The CGSO is responsible for hosting workshops aimed at improving teaching and research effectiveness, organizing and implementing the annual departmental research symposium, addressing student concerns, enhancing communication between faculty and students, and assisting with orientation of incoming graduate students.

iLEAD, INSPIRE, NEWTWORK, CONNECT (ILINC) STUDENT ASSOCIATION: The mission of iLINC Co, the student association of the Rehabilitation & Mental Health Counseling program at The University of South Florida, is to lead, inspire, network and connect the students within the program to the bridge that will connect their present path to their future career goals.

SOCIAL WORK SOCIETY STUDENT ORGANIZATION (SWS): is housed within the USF School of Social Work, is a student organization open to all undergraduate and graduate students at the university. The primary aims of the society are twofold: First, to promote positive socialization among students interested in issues of social justice and positive social change; and second, to raise funds and engage in service activities that address human needs and social justice concerns both on campus and within communities locally, regionally, and nationally.

INSIDE ART: Since 2010, the USF Contemporary Art Museum, the USF College of Education, and the Hillsborough County Public Schools have been collaborating on Inside Art, an innovative web-based visual literacy program that integrates social studies with contemporary art in an examination and discussion of critical societal issues. In addition to the online curriculum, vital components of the program include professional development opportunities for teachers and field trips to USF for K-12 students.

BUSINESS

THE BUSINESS ENGAGEMENT: A way of connecting employers with students, faculty, staff, student organizations at the USF Muma College of Business. It helps create relationships that lead to career placement, increase brand presence, increase involvement in student projects, participation at career events, and hands-on research.



EDUCATION

TUTOR-A-BULL: This program increases motivation for learning, provides experiences for education majors to practice teaching in real-life settings, and provides academic support to middle and high school students who are struggling in school.

JANE GOODALL ROOTS & SHOOTS PROGRAM: The USF/HCPS Elementary Partnership is focused on the learning outcomes of children in grades K-5. The administration at the partnership schools and the faculty from the College of Education and the College of Arts and Sciences work collaboratively to facilitate enhanced learning opportunities for the teachers and children within the partnership schools. With kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, and 4th grade students at the helm, these Roots & Shoots projects will support the knowledge and understanding of life sciences, offer students the opportunity to engage in long-term investigations, and demonstrate how children can take a major role in evolving their community.

ASSOCIATION FOR CHILDHOOD EDUCATION INTERNATIONAL (ACEI): A diverse global community dedicated to the education and development of children from birth through adolescence.

ALLIANCE OF HEALTH AND FITNESS PROFESSIONALS (AHFP): is an official USF student organization designed to provide exercise science majors with a variety of professional development and leadership experiences. Activities include preparing for certifications in the field, attending professional conferences, participating in volunteer community projects and programs, and coordinating many local educational and social events.

ASSOCIATION OF PHYSICAL ED. COLLEGE STUDENTS (APECS): is open to all students enrolled in the K-12 Physical Education Program. Social and professional meetings are conducted throughout the year. Professional service to the community is also provided by the association.

HONOR SOCIETIES

PI LAMBDA THETA (PLT): Founded in 1910, Pi Lambda Theta (PLT) is one of the most prestigious education honor societies. PLT is part of the Phi Delta Kappa (PDK) International family of education associations and is governed by the PDK International Board of Directors. **KAPPA DELTA PI (KDP):** is an international honor society in Education, and the Lambda Tau chapter has been on the USF campus for over 44 years.

LIVING-LEARNING COMMUNITY (EDUCARE): Students interested in the College of Education upon admission have the opportunity to live on-campus in a living learning community: a theme-based, academically centered residence hall. As a member of eduCARE, the College of Education's living learning community, students will have the opportunity to live amongst peers who share an appreciation for education. Students in eduCARE will enjoy academic support, guided career exploration.

THE SUNCOAST AREA TEACHER TRAINING & EDUCATION RESEARCH (SCATTER): is an awardwinning teacher training program designed to enhance the outstanding teacher preparation programs offered within the USF College of Education. Its mission is to enhance the teaching profession by establishing high performance expectations for all members and offering research-based learning experiences that support exceptional instruction.

STUDENT COUNCIL FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN (SCEC): is an organization open to students from across the university who appreciate the diversity present in our schools and society and are interested in the education of children and young adults with exceptionalities. Activities of the USF Chapter include a variety of service projects, as well as support of the College of Education Children's Festival, Special Olympics, and field trips.

USF TRANSFER STUDENT ORGANIZATION (TSO): They intend to help guide transfer students in any area that deals with their transfer stage and continue to be a resource throughout their time at the University of South Florida. They will focus on professional, social, and community service aspects and act as a gateway for transfer students to get involved around campus, and become more active in the community

STUDENTS IN FREE ENTERPRISE: The mission of this student group is to serve members of the community through educational outreach projects that embody social, economic, environmental, personal, ethical, and sustainable change.

HONORS COLLEGE

HONORS STUDENT COUNCIL: is the student led organization that sponsors a number of academic, social, and service activities tailored to the Honors student throughout the semester. Their vision is to create an active and consistent community within the Honors College capable of promoting ongoing honors programs.

HONORS PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA: The Honors Philharmonic Orchestra made its debut in fall 1997, playing Phantom of the Opera, The Entertainer, and even an original piece that was composed by a student. THE MARINE SCIENCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE (MSAC): is the student government and only student organization for the College of Marine Science (CMS). Their main purpose is to provide an interface between students and faculty at CMS and to improve the academic atmosphere and quality of life for Marine Science students and faculty. They have an open membership to all students, regardless of level or discipline and encourage non Marine Science students to become more involved with CMS activities.

COLLEGES NURSING

SIGMA THETA TAU: The mission of the Honor Society of Nursing, Sigma Theta Tau International, is advancing world health and celebrating nursing excellence in scholarship, leadership, and service. Their vision is to be the global organization of choice for nursing.

USF HEALTH INTERNATIONAL: is deeply committed to enhancing the health of populations worldwide through an interdisciplinary collaboration between the USF colleges of medicine, nursing, pharmacy and public health and the school of physical therapy. At USF Health, faculty, staff and students work collaboratively with academic institutions, health care facilities and communities across nations to exchange knowledge, build capacity and bring the latest in health care innovation, thus making life better globally.

PHARMACY

COLLEGE OF PHARMACY STUDENT LEADERSHIP COUNCIL (SLC): The SLC seeks to develop its future pharmacy leaders by establishing a culture of camaraderie and unity among all COP students. The purpose of the Student Leadership Council is to do just that, build leaders. Speaking up at Student Body meetings, joining in Leadership Guest Speaker Series discussions, participating in COP events and fundraisers, and contributing to the decision-making processes within the organization are all essential aspects of being a leader. AMERICAN PHARMACISTS ASSOCIATION ACADEMY OF STUDENT PHARMACISTS (APHA-A SP): The mission is to be the collective voice of student pharmacists, to provide opportunities for professional growth, to improve patient care, and to envision and advance the future of pharmacy.

STUDENT NATIONAL PHARMACEUTICAL ASSOCIATION (SNPHA): is an educational service association of pharmacy students who are concerned about pharmacy and healthcare related issues, and the poor minority representation in pharmacy and other health-related professions. The purpose of SNPhA is to plan, organize, coordinate and execute programs geared toward the improvement for the health, educational, and social environment of the community.

PUBLIC HEALTH

PUBLIC HEALTH STUDENT ASSOCIATION (PHSA): represents students in their pursuit of a graduate level degree in Public Health or an undergraduate Public Health minor and encourages active participation in developing community public health awareness. It is also the purpose of the Association to encourage the interaction of students with faculty and staff so students may have some impact over program matters, knowledge of educational opportunities, and guidance in directing their Public Health careers.

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INFECTIOUS DISEASE ASSOCIATION (IDA): The mission is to promote the understanding of infectious diseases through guest lectures, student presentations, field trips and group discussions.

INTERNATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE COLLABORATIVE (IHSC): The International Health Service Collaborative is a group of USF Health Students, Faculty and Professionals focused on promoting Sustainable Health in underserved communities within the U.S. and developing nations.

THE ARTS

COLLEGE OF THE ARTS COUNCIL: seeks to bring together the disciplines of Art & Art History, Music, Theatre, Architecture & Community Design, and Dance. Within the Council, each discipline has it is own elected representative. The Council seeks to involve students both in their respective colleges and those in other areas further in the Arts.

ARCHITECTURE COLLEGE COUNCIL (ACC): is a Student government organization established for students interested in architecture.

AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTURE STUDENTS (AIAS) USF CHAPTER: The national student organization focuses on supporting students in the architecture program through collaboration, training and practice.

ANNUAL BEAUX ARTS BALL: An annual ball that is organized by both AIAS and ACC. This wellestablished event is in its 21st year.

ART HISTORY ASSOCIATION: Student organization that focuses on promoting the scholarship of Art History by facilitating relationships among students, faculty and the greater community.

MFA ORGANIZATION: is a student organization focusing on graduate studio students in Art and Art History, but open to all USF students.

BFA ORGANIZATION: Student organization focusing on supporting the painting and drawing programs through exhibitions at galleries on and off-campus.

LI'L MUDDIES FUN BUNCH: Student organization focusing on the Ceramic Arts outside the classroom.

PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB: Student organization focusing on supporting the photo program through the organization of exhibitions at on and off-campus galleries.

DOWN & DIRTY PRINTMAKING COLLECTIVE: is a student organization focusing on teaching and promoting printmaking.

COLLEGIATE MUSIC EDUCATORS NATIONAL CONFERENCE (CMENC): The collegiate level allows students like Music Education students to get a head start on their professions. CMENC allows its members to get different kinds of experience that will help them in the Music Education field ranging from experience in teaching to experience in organizing concerts. They also do philanthropic events and try to help schools in the area by doing things like benefit concerts.

GOSPEL CHOIR AT USF: USF Gospel Choir performs African American Gospel Music and Spirituals.

HERD OF THUNDER MARCHING BAND & PEP BAND: The USF "Herd of Thunder" ("H.O.T.") Marching Band is 225+ members strong in 2009! The HOT Band performs at all USF home football games in the 75,000 seat Raymond James Stadium (home of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers!), as well as selected away games and Bowl games. The Marching Band currently requires auditions for the Drumline and Colorguard, but all wind players with previous band experience are accepted.

PHI MU ALPHA: The object of this Fraternity shall be for the development of the best and truest fraternal spirit; the mutual welfare and brotherhood of musical students; the advancement of music in America and a loyalty to the Alma Mater.

SIGMA ALPHA IOTA: The mission of Sigma Alpha lota International Music Fraternity is to encourage, nurture, and support the art of music.


