University of South Florida's Global and National Security Institute Signs Academic Agreement with Poland's War Studies University

TAMPA, Fla. – The University of South Florida's Global and National Security Institute (GNSI) has entered into a multiyear academic and research agreement with the War Studies University in Warsaw, Poland, strengthening international collaboration on global security education and research.

The newly signed agreement outlines a range of joint activities that include educational initiatives and scholarly exchange programs. Both institutions will engage in collaborative research, the exchange of visiting scholars, and the potential exchange of undergraduate and graduate students for independent or cooperative research efforts.

"This agreement underscores GNSI's commitment to building a global academic network to address complex security challenges," said General (Ret) Frank McKenzie, executive director of GNSI. "We are proud to partner with Poland's premier defense university to promote scholarly exchange and advance research that contributes to national and global security."

The partnership also allows for the exchange of academic materials such as research papers, book publications, and indices to theses. Faculty and students from both institutions will be invited to participate in national and international conferences and scholarly meetings.

"Our longstanding belief at the War Studies University is 'We respect tradition, we build the future,' said Colonel Andrzej Soboń, Dean of National Security Faculty of War Studies University. "This partnership with GNSI is a great example of two organizations from across the globe working and learning together to build a better future for both our countries."

This new agreement expands GNSI's strategic academic footprint in Poland. The institute already maintains a similar partnership with the General Tadeusz Kościuszko Military University of Land Forces in Wrocław.



By strengthening ties with these leading Polish institutions, GNSI aims to foster deeper transatlantic academic collaboration and prepare future leaders to address emerging global threats.
