- Professional Statement (500 words)
- Personal Statement

- Three letter of recommendation forms

Select a cross-section of references, including employers, faculty or other individuals who have evaluated your work and can speak to your academic abilities and/or related paid social work or volunteer experience. Provide details about each recommender with an email address, and an email to the online recommendation form will be

sent to the recommender. Personal References DO NOT include relatives.

 Unofficial transcripts from each institution of higher learning

(Minimum GPA of 3.0 required)

GRE: Not required. However, applicants with a GPA less than 3.0 can submit GRE scores for consideration.

Quantitative (144 or higher) and Verbal (153 or higher)

Work Experience: It is preferred but not required that all applicants to the Master's Degree program in Social Work have completed one year of post-undergraduate work in a social service agency (in a service capacity) or its equivalent.
